

The Division of Hematology / Oncology, Section of Hematology and Stem Cell Transplant at Vanderbilt University Medical Center, in Nashville TN invites applications for a faculty position in stem cell transplant. Applicants will be considered at all levels: Assistant, Associate, or Professor.

Vanderbilt University Medical Center has one of the largest programs of clinical stem cell transplant in the Southeast region, and is highly respected for its exceptional attention to patient care, innovative approaches to transplant, and integration with a variety of research programs at the University. Currently, over 400 transplants are conducted each year, and the program prides itself on integration across pediatric and adult disease, a strong collaborative link to one of the only VA health centers offering stem cell transplant in the U.S., a robust long-term follow up clinic and graft vs host disease research program, and integration with excellent programs in CAR-T cell therapy, Sickle Cell Anemia, and other cellular therapies. The division hosts a strong fellowship program, and supports fellowship opportunities in stem cell transplant.

Appointment within the Clinician Educator track relies on excellence in clinical care and clinical teaching, and in this role, a dedication to leading clinical research initiatives and enrolling patients on clinical trials. Leadership positions will be considered depending on level of clinical, or research achievements and administration experience.

The successful applicant must have an MD or equivalent, be licensed or eligible for licensure in the state of Tennessee, and must be board certified or board eligible. Completion of stem cell transplant fellowship for junior faculty is preferred. The successful applicant will have strong clinical skills, a potential for excellence in clinical research, a desire to work with novel therapies and a growing, vibrant clinical practice and outstanding colleagues and collaborators in the Division of Hematology/Oncology.
